



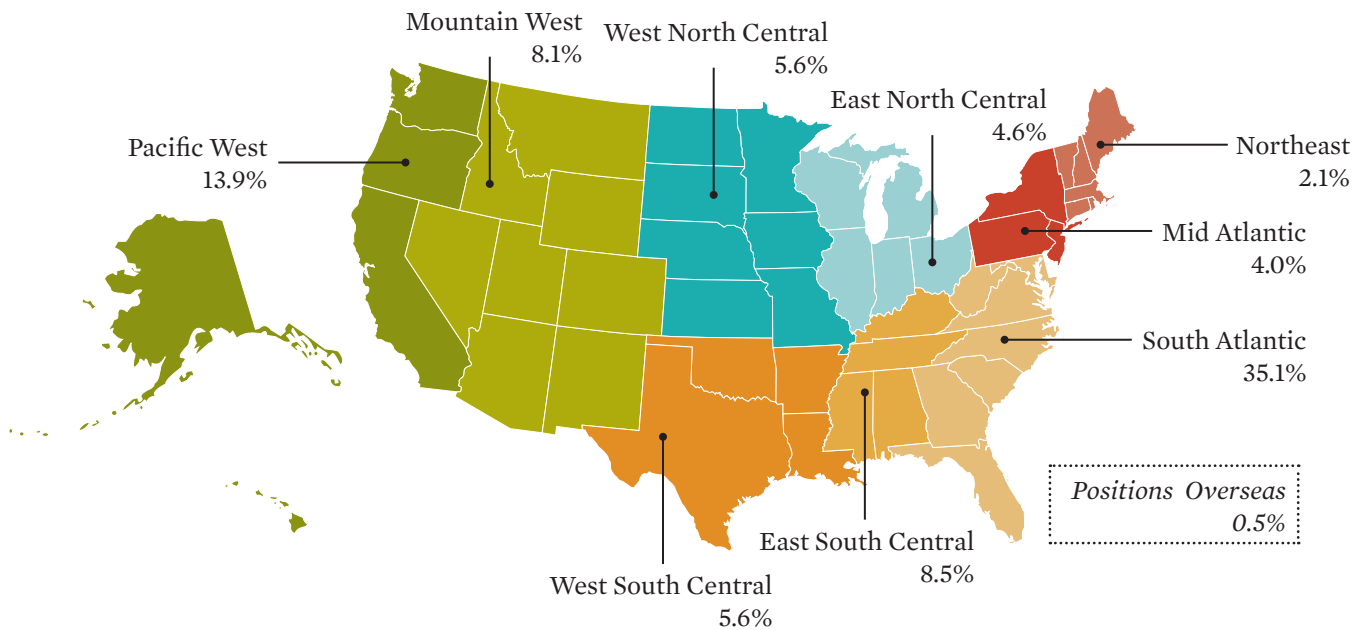

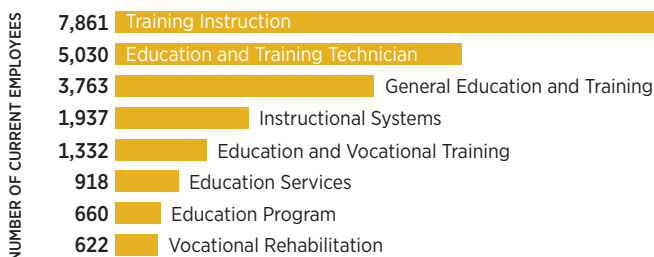
Are you interested in pursuing a job in an education field? The federal government offers a variety of opportunities for individuals with knowledge and skills in teaching, training, instructional systems and more. For example, educators teach pre-kindergarten to children of military families for the Department of the Army, education program specialists develop training workshops for Foreign Service personnel at the Department of State, and counselors assist federal prison inmates with vocational rehabilitation through the Department of Justice.

Education Positions by Region

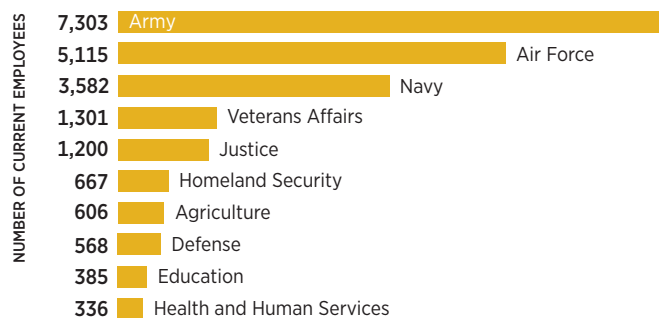


Top Education Fields

You can search [USAJOBS.gov](https://www.usajobs.gov) using these keywords or by using the job series code, a four-digit number corresponding to a government job category.

Did You Know?

- Only 2 percent of education jobs in the federal government are with the Department of Education.
- The average salary for federal jobs in education is just over \$70,000 per year.
- States with the most education positions include Texas, California, Georgia and Florida.

Foreign Language Teacher (1701)

Department: Department of the Army
Agency: Army Training and Doctrine Command
Salary Range: \$38,000-\$61,000/year
Location: Leavenworth, Kansas

As a Foreign Language Teacher, you will:

- Teach listening, reading, writing and speaking skills, as well as geopolitical, economic and social issues, at the Defense Language Institute Foreign Language Center
- Prepare lesson plans, adapt teaching materials, check homework and administer and grade tests

Supervisory Guidance Counselor (1740)

Department: Department of Agriculture
Agency: U.S. Forest Service
Salary Range: \$56,000-\$73,000/year
Location: Throughout the nation

As a Supervisory Guidance Counselor, you will:

- Provide a full range of general educational and career development counseling to students in the Forest Service Job Corps Civilian Conservation Center
- Develop and implement individualized counseling strategies on a wide variety of educational and vocational needs
- Perform administrative and human resources management functions related to the staff supervised
